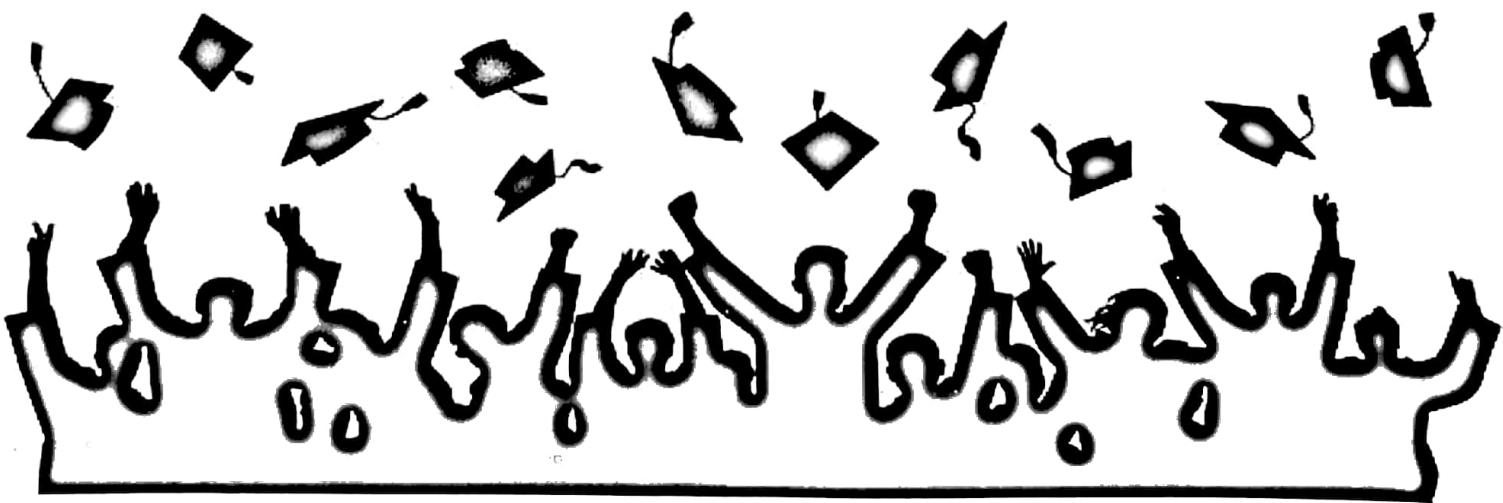

After being diagnosed with lupus in 2005, AJ persevered; After graduating from Huntsville High School in 2006, she completed one year at Jarvis Christian College before her illness became debilitating. During her time brightening the world, she formed her own business, raised a beautiful daughter, Amaya, and provided counseling, advice, and encouragement to others who were struggling with the same illness. |
| American Legion Auxiliary Scholarship | The American Legion Sam Houston Unit 95 scholarships are available to high school seniors who are the child, grandchild or great-grandchild of a Veteran who served in the Armed Forces during times of war. Selection of the recipients is based upon character, citizenship, need, objective and war services of the Veteran they qualify through. Unit 95 sponsors these scholarships through their various fundraising events throughout the year. |
| Ann Froelich Memorial Scholarship | Ann Froelich devoted her life to education. She worked as a Professor of History at Sam Houston State University for eight years. Then, making the move to Huntsville High School, she served as a counselor and assistant principal for five years and principal of Huntsville High School for thirteen years. At the time of her retirement she had served in the education profession for thirty years. Ann believed in providing opportunities to students and pushing them to achieve their dreams. She took pride in the success of each and every one of her students, and loved to hear about where life had taken them. She knew that the educators that had impacted their lives along the way were a critical piece to each student’s success. |
| BEARKAT Advantage Scholarship | Sam Houston State University and Huntsville High School’s partnership in education. Given to two students attending SHSU upon graduation in the amount of \$1000 each. |

| Cally Belcher Memorial Scholarship | Cally Belcher was a 1990 graduate of Huntsville High School. As number 22, he was a starter for the Hornet football team 1987-1988 where he earned First Team All-District in 1988 and 1989 at Strong Safety. He went on to have an outstanding career at Stephen F. Austin University as number 16. While playing for the Lumberjacks, Cally was named two time All-Southland Conference. He was described as a football player's player. Coaches often use words to describe what a football player is, such as character, determination, courage, leadership, and the love of the game. Cally Belcher embodied all these qualities. John Pearce, SFA Head Coach in 1994, stated that in the past 25 years, few players have ever represented his family, his teammates, his hometown, and his school better than Cally Blecher. This Scholarship is given to an outstanding athlete in honor of his memory. |
| City of Huntsville Employees Scholarship | The City of Huntsville Employees Scholarship Fund was established to aid permanent full or part-time City employees' dependent children and/or stepchildren with higher educational expenses including accredited colleges, vocational schools or other institutions of learning. The fund is composed entirely from City of Huntsville employee's payroll deductions. |
| Cody McKinley Memorial Scholarship | Cody graduated from Huntsville High School in 2002 and later graduated from Sam Houston State University with a degree in Education in 2009. He lived in Huntsville, Texas most of his life. He started his coaching career at Huntsville ISD and later worked in the oil and gas industry. Cody loved the outdoors, fishing, hunting, and mostly playing golf. His greatest joy was his two boys. His love for sports and competitive nature were instilled in his children. |
| Cole Pegoda Memorial Scholarship | This scholarship is in memory of our son, Cole Pegoda. Cole started his welding career as a welder's helper on the pipeline. He became a rope access welder often hanging hundreds of feet in the air to weld on large oil rigs in the gulf. He loved to send home really scary pictures of him high above the ground or water. He obtained numerous certifications and carried around a folder full of his accomplishments, in case they were required for the next job. His passion for the trade was often seen when he would take young welders under his wing and help them obtain their own certifications. It is our family's hope to keep paying it forward as he did through this scholarship. This scholarship is given to a graduating senior who intends to pursue a career in welding. The Pegoda family appreciates the community's outpouring of support and plans to continue their fundraising efforts in hopes of helping graduating seniors in the years to come. |

| Daughters of American Revolution Mary Bush Smither/Virginia Kreig Scholarship Award | The Mary Martin Elmore Scott Chapter of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution will present a \$500 scholarship to an outstanding, SHSU bound female student from Huntsville High School in memory of Mary Bush Smither. |
| Delta Sigma Theta, Frankie Grover/ Maggie Smith Scholarship | Delta Sigma Theta Sorority was founded by twenty-two collegiate women who wanted to use their collective strength to promote academic excellence and to provide assistance to those in need. Following in the footsteps of their founders, the Huntsville Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta established the <i>Frankie Grover- Maggie Smith Scholarship</i> . The scholarship is named in memory of two of its beloved members who were both longtime educators. It provides financial support to graduating high school seniors desiring to pursue a higher education. <i>"Delta Sigma Theta – A Sisterhood Called to Serve: Transforming Lives, Impacting Communities."</i> |
| Detour Film Production Scholarship | The Detour Film Production Scholarship was started in 2005 by Huntsville High School alum Richard Linklater. The scholarship is awarded annually to HHS seniors and is open to all students but hopes to award the scholarship to students pursuing the arts in college and beyond. |
| Forrest Masonic Lodge Academic Scholarship | This scholarship is presented to a graduating senior of Huntsville High School. |
| Fitzgerald-Covington Family Scholarship | This scholarship was established to honor Cecil and Dorothy Fitzgerald from Riverside and Billy and Vera Covington of Madisonville. These relatives of the donors, Bill and Evelyn Dawson, placed a high value on education and were supportive of anyone who worked hard to obtain one. This renewable scholarship of \$1000 per semester will be given to a student who will be attending Sam Houston State University. The scholarship will be given for up to four years for each fall and spring, totaling \$8000. |
| Forrest Masonic Lodge Luke Wayne Countz Academic Scholarship | This scholarship is named for Luke Wayne Countz who was a 1943 graduate of Huntsville High School and also had 3 sons who are graduates of Huntsville High. Mr. Countz was a Past Master of Forrest Masonic Lodge and served as lodge secretary for 20 years. |
| Forrest Masonic Lodge J.D. Dickenson Academic Scholarship | This scholarship is presented to a graduating high school senior who is the child or grandchild of a member of Forrest Masonic Lodge No. 19. It is named for J. D. Dickenson, who is a Past Master of Forrest Masonic Lodge and longtime lodge secretary. |
| GATES Scholarship | The GATES Scholarship is a rigorous, academic scholarship for higher education, available to high-achieving minority students in the United States. It was established in 1999 and funded by Microsoft founder Bill Gates through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The application process takes place in three phases. After the initial review of over 36,000 applicants, it is narrowed to 2000 semi-finalists, then after multiple rounds of essays and interviews, 300 recipients are chosen. The Gates Scholarship covers tuition, fees, room, board, books and transportation costs. |

| Gloria S. Sale/ Bryan Coca-Cola Educational Fund Scholarship | For almost 40 years, Gloria Stephan Sale ran the Bryan Coca-Cola Bottling Company with a strong hand and a keen wit. She was one of the first women to run a major business locally. When she died at age 75, Bryan-College Station lost a good friend. She wasn't open about her generosity, but her kindnesses over the years made life better for generations of local residents. Sale understood that success in business doesn't mean much if you aren't successful as a member of a community. Because she believed in paying forward into the future, she left three trusts: one for scholarships of regional students, another for the beautification of her town, Bryan, and lastly funds for her spiritual home, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. Gloria Stephan Sale left the community a far better place that she found it. |
| God's Giving Foundation Scholarship | "A tribute of love from one to another," is the purpose of the God's Given Foundation Scholarship organized by Pat Oliphant after the serious car accident of James Oliphant Senior and her son, Coach Jay Oliphant. "The outpouring of love exhibited to our family made me want to give back to this wonderful community for catastrophic illnesses and accidents. We honor students who participate in our gospel singing programs on Saturday nights to raise money to help others." |
| GRMC Scholarship | Greater Robinson Memorial Church of God in Christ Scholarship is a financial award to each faithful student of its local assembly. The S&K Scholarship is a financial award created on behalf and in honor of our two children for their deep love and involvement in promoting a better and higher education. |
| Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center | Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center Commitment for Life awards 43 scholarships valued at \$63,000 in total |
| Hazel Wyatt Memorial Scholarship | Mrs. Hazel Wyatt was a very well-known citizen in the city of Huntsville and surrounding areas. As a generous and active participant in the community, she was a member of the Huntsville Beautification Committee, Walker County Democrats, the Walker-Trinity County NAACP, and an officer for the Class of 1970, just to name a few. She worked tirelessly with organizations, such as God's Giving Foundation, to assist families that were in need and often donated to various youth and their endeavors. As a fervent worker and servant for approximately 50 years, she became manager of Security Finance Services for 30+ years. Because of her involvement in the community and her cheerful giving, the organizers of this scholarship thought it would be fitting to find a way to keep her legacy alive by giving 2-3 high school students a scholarship in her honor. |
| Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarships | Since its beginning in 1932, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has committed over \$430 million to educational and youth programs for students in the State of Texas. In 2019, the HLSR Scholarship Program will award and fund more than 750 scholarships to outstanding Texas students. |
| The Huntsville 4H/FFA Agriculture Booster and Alumni Club Scholarship | The Huntsville 4H/FFA Agriculture Booster and Alumni Club was a club developed about 30 years ago to help both of these programs to grow and to give scholarships. |

Texas A&M and the relationships created there have had a positive impact on our lives, and we would like to help other generations have the same opportunities and experiences. |
