This Juneteenth Celebration opens with the unveiling of the HIFI Outdoor Photo Exhibition panels revealing little known facts about the accomplishments of black and white patriots who helped advance education, emancipation and equal rights in the greater Huntsville area. The multi-location outdoor exhibits will highlight the stories and accomplishments of oft-over-looked Texas historical figures who —despite Jim Crow—were determined to improve the lives, educational access and business opportunities of East Texas' African-American communities. Honored will be folks such as Joshua and Virginia Houston, Samuel Walker

Houston, Mrs. Esther Bridges, Wendell Baker, Sr., Dr. Naomi Lede, General Sam Houston, Doc Pleasant William Kittrell and the millionaire philanthropist Julius Rosenwald. The VIP reception and multi-location photo exhibit will be free to the public and curated by **Linda Moten**, of the Samuel Walker Houston Museum, the Samuel Walker Houston Elementary and Samuel Walker Houston High School alumni organizations. www.hifieventsnow.org

WHO / WHAT WAS THE INFORMER NETWORK?:

The Texas Freeman newspaper was first published in 1893 bravely announcing the news "Without Fear or Favor." Later merging to become the Informer and Texas Freeman, the newspaper became the hub of a multi-city syndicate of information conduits, chronicling the news of, by and for black folk in Houston, Huntsville, Dallas, Galveston, Beaumont, San Antonio, Austin, Shreveport and New Orleans, Louisiana and even Jackson, Mississippi. By the 1950s, the paper was a major player in advancing the call for equal rights for citizens of African descent. The Huntsville Informer will be revived, reimagined and distributed at all three events here.

THE HUNTSVILLE INFORMER will be resurrected and distributed as an ebook and printed purveyor of historical facts at each of the "**Step Back**" events.

This unique approach to generating an interest and educating the public of the stories and lessons the past has to offer is a perfect fit for the history-loving hometown of General Sam Houston!

ROSENWALD SCHOOL ACRES: The History of Walker County's 1st Tuskegee-Rosenwald School

"An Oasis of Education"

Julius Rosenwald (1862-1932) Chicago philanthropist and part-owner of Sears and Roebuck, believed all Americans deserve an education. **1912:** He established the Rosenwald Fund for *"the well-being of mankind"* and collaborated with Booker T. Washington and Tuskegee Institute to build over 5,350 + rural school buildings for colored children across in 15 southern states. 79 schools were built in Texas.





John Wesley Wilson (8/12/1860 - 4/20/1948) and his wife, Amarintha Kittrell Wilson (8/9/1864 - 4/4/1944)...well-connected, educated and concerned about providing a formal education for their little brown grandchildren. **1921:** As per Rosenwald Fund guidelines, the couple transferred 2 acres of land to the HuntsvilleISD and, with family and community, raised the funds needed for the creation of the original 2-room school building with a kitchen, well and 2 outhouses. John and Amarintha's

children, cousins and grandchildren attended & helped maintain It.*

1921-1962: With dedicated educators such as **Esther Bridges, Maddy Jewel Walker, Thelma McGuire, Mary Helen Wilson** (alumni & granddaughter of John & Amarintha), plus volunteers from the **Kittrell, Wilson, Spivey, Cotton, Wiley, Vann, Baker, Crawford, Houston** families et.al, Rosenwald School grew until "**Rosenwald School Road**" was the place to go for meetings, events, picnics, horse & foot races, basketball, etc. (*The name was later shortened & misspelled as "Rosenwall Road.*")



1962: Rosenwald School#1 is demolished and the land auctioned to **David Branch Jr.** who, in **1963**, sold it back to **Charlie Wilson** (John & Amarintha's eldest son).



1966: Mary Helen Wilson Wiseman, M.Ed. requested that her father Charlie will the beloved school grounds to her.

2020: Rosenwald Acres was inherited by Mary Helen's eldest, **Kijana Wiseman-Fusilier, M.Ed.** (*WisemanCompany.com, kijana.com*); with **Joy D. Wiseman** and **LaTanya Michell Brooks, M.Ed.** (*GrowWithStem.com, nextlevelpublishing.com*). **NOW:** The land has being renewed as a community space with an energy/ environmentally-friendly, solar-lighted Outdoor Stage where the school once stood.

*Rosenwald Founders and Caregivers are interred in the **Kittrell - Wilson Cemetery** behind the property. A portion of funds is dedicated to the maintenance of those graves.

ONE FINAL HISTORICAL PROJECT:

Correct the misspelled "Rosenwall Road." ...Return it to its historically accurate "Rosenwald Road" ...honoring the name and legacy of Julius Rosenwald—an early 20th century multimillionaire philanthropist who joined with Tuskegee Institute to make a huge impact on the educational history of Huntsville/Walker County Texas. (More info: RosenwaldAcres.com).

1912: Julius Rosenwald, then president of Sears and Roebuck, donated \$25,000 to Tuskegee Institute. That was when he discovered that southern states were not building public schools for their African American citizens. **In 1915,** he began a financial collaboration with Booker T. Washington and Tuskegee Institute and eventually donated \$63 million of his personal income to subsidize the building of 5,357 schools for African American students in 15 southern states. Texas received \$980,615 in grants to build 79 schools and over 500 supplemental buildings.

WALKER COUNTY'S 2 TUSKEGEE-ROSENWALD SCHOOLS: *Huntsville/Walker County was the only ISD in Texas that had multiple Rosenwald funded buildings.* In 1921, Huntsville's gifted Professor Samuel Walker Houston, his cousin English professor John Wesley Wilson and John's wife Amarentha Kittrell-Wilson began to plan, build and maintain the following institutions in Walker County, utilizing multiple Rosenwald Fund grants:

Rosenwald School #1: "an Oasis of Education." The wagon trail that became a road once dead-ended at the historic Rosenwald School Acres gate. This newly reopened gate is the 102 year old location of Walker County's first public grade school for colored children...Our annual EarthDay Festival and community events on the H-E-B sponsored stage allows families a chance to return to their gathering place.

The Samuel W. Houston Industrial and Training Institute opened its doors on Highway 30 (near the current Walker County Fair Grounds) in 1906— teaching marketable occupational skills: carpentry, plumbing, sewing, cosmetology, general maintenance, fine arts and music. Good works were recognized by Tuskegee Institute. The Rosenwald Fund awarded repeat grants. This allowed Prof. Houston to build multiple buildings—even creating Texas' first boarding school for African American school children. The Samuel W Houston Museum, formerly the High, then Primary school on 10th Street in Huntsville, stands as a tribute to this great educator.

THE ROSENWALD FUND

Julius Rosenwald (1862-1932)

Chicago businessman, philanthropist and president of Sears, Roebuck and Company during the early 1900s. Rosenwald's German-Jewish family fled persecution in Europe.

Rosenwald established the Rosenwald Foundation for "the well-being of mankind"

He funded 5,357 schools in Black communities because he believed that everyone deserves the opportunity to an education.

"Rosenwald" Road is not a name change...only a clerical correction.

The US Congressional Julius Rosenwald and Rosenwald School's Act, signed in 2021, has recorded Huntsville's two schools and their locations—one on *"Rosenwall"* Rd—in its national registry. The Rosenwald School Road's original name was both a tribute and "Thank You" from a grateful community honoring the name of a compassionate businessman whose generosity made their beloved school possible—providing hope and opportunities for their children's futures.

It is time for Huntsville/Walker County authorities to join the United States Congress' commitment to honor this great man, by correcting the incorrect spelling the road that bears his name.
